The Fall Performance Season will ignite with Copernicus, "The Angel Exterminator of poet/performer/philosophers" performing 10 concerts solo at Theatre Row's Judith Anderson Theatre this month.

This series of spoken word concerts follows his most recent appearances at Soho's Synchronicity Space where he played to standing room only audiences in reminiscence of his 1989 Eastern European tour where he played to an audience of 3,000 in Moscow and 9,000 in Prague.

His iconoclastic pieces are drawn from his four albums, *Nothing Exists*, *Victim Of The Sky*, *Deeper*, and *Null* in which he struggles to present his new definition of reality. In these pieces he makes transparent and shatters the myths created by the status quo in a most intimate exchange with his audience—"a genuine poet/performer whose soul screams for eternal release."
